##### Business:

At the upcoming rally on Saturday night we will be having our next Board Meeting. We will be accepting nominations for President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, along with nominations for board members at the meeting.

To be an Officer, your primary residence has to be in NH. A board member can live anywhere. All positions are open for nominations.

From our constitution, here are the descriptions of the roles of the officers and board members:

The holders of the principal four offices (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) will be responsible for the discharge of duties legally and traditionally assigned to those offices.

##### Section 4.a: Duties of the President

The **President** is the Chief Executive Officer of the club, the Chairman of the Board, and the club's principal representative in all internal and external affairs.

- a) to preside at all meetings of the club
- b) to have general supervision of the affairs of the club
- c) oversee and coordinate the work of the various Board members and committees
- d) to assist all other officers of the club in their duties
- e) cosign checks of the club under conditions established by the club constitution and bylaws

##### Section 4.b: Duties of the **Vice President**

- a) by consent of the President, perform the duties of the President whenever the latter is absent or otherwise unable to discharge the duties of that office
- b) in the event the President's position becomes vacant, serve as Acting President until a permanent replacement is chosen by the Board.
- c) carry out tasks assigned by the President

#### Section 4.c: Duties of the **Secretary**

The Secretary is the chief administrative officer of the club, and is responsible for the maintenance of the legal records of the club. The Secretary shall perform all corporation duties as prescribed by the State of New Hampshire and such duties may not be delegated to any other club member.

- a) keep and maintain as required by the club or law, the club's Corporate Seal and all legal documents relating to the club, including Articles of Incorporation, the club's constitution and bylaws, Corporate Charter Certificate, government tax exemption documents, etc.
- b) attend, and take and keep minutes of all regular and special meetings, or delegate these duties if unable to attend
- c) record all officer and committee appointments and elections and cause them to be published in the club newsletter
- d) promptly notify all members who have been nominated for elected positions of their nomination and shall promptly notify the Board of those members' acceptance or rejection of their nomination.
- e) send out notices of regular or special meetings, or notify the editor of the club newsletter to publish those notices in the next regular issue
- f) handle all club correspondence
- g) perform other such duties as generally fall to that office
- h) Where the President is unable to discharge the duties of that office and there is no Vice President, the Secretary shall act as the Vice President and shall perform the duties of the President as stated in the section Duties of the Vice President.
- i) Maintain membership database

#### Section 4.d: Duties of the Treasurer

The **Treasurer** is the chief financial officer of the club, and is responsible for the monitoring and reporting of all its finances.

- a) keep up-to-date records of the club's finances and deliver reports on a timely basis (This duty may not be delegated to any other club member.)
- b) maintain the club's bank accounts
- c) collect dues from all the members
- d) collect all other money due the club
- e) sign or cosign checks of the club under conditions established by the club constitution and bylaws (This duty may not be delegated to any other club member.)

#### Section 5: Duties of the **Board of Directors**

Oversee the elected officers
